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What is VET funding
VET Funding is a course costs paid by the government. Currently, you can only access your VET funding once, however some RTO's may allow you to access your funding twice. If you have used your VET funding for a course you will need to pay for any other courses you wish to undertake. Usually it is only Cert 1 or Cert II courses that are VET funded.

Cert I in Construction (VET funded or Cost Involved)

Carpentry, Cabinet Making, Builder, Furniture Maker, Employable in this Industry.

Cert II in Engineering Pathways

(VET funded or Cost Involved)

Designer, Fitter & Turner, Machinist, Metal Fabrication, Pattern Maker, Diesel Fitter, Lab Tech, Moulder, Sheet Metal worker.

Cert II in Electrotechnology

(VET funded or Cost Involved)

Electrician

Cert III in Engineering – CAD (FREE)

Graphic Design, Industrial Graphics, CAD Draftsperson/operator, Engineering, Technical Officer.

Cert III in Fitness with Cert II Sport embedded

(VET funded or Cost Involved)

Gym Instructor, A stepping stone to becoming a Personal Trainer.

Cert III in Business (Cost Involved)

Customer Service Adviser, Data Entry Clerk, General Clerk, Payroll Officer, Typist, Word Processing Operator

Cert IV in Business (Cost Involved)

Accounts Clerk, E-business Practitioner, Legal Receptionist, Medical Receptionist, Office Admin Assistant

Diploma in Business (Cost Involved)

Pathway to University, Managing Finances, Marketing and Recruiting processes

Tertiary Selection Rank

Undertaking a Cert III, IV or Diploma course can provide opportunities for entry into a University Course.

Cert III currently awards a Tertiary Rank of 68 (approx. OP15 equivalent)

Cert IV currently awards a Tertiary Rank of 74 (approx. OP12 equivalent)

A Diploma currently awards a Tertiary Rank of 82 (approx. OP 8-9 equivalent)

WORK EXPERIENCE

Work Experience is an opportunity that all students can undertake.

The benefits of work experience are;

1. *It is a try before you buy scenario.*
2. *Opportunity to dabble in an occupation you have been interested in.*
3. *You may like your experience or you may decide that the occupation isn't for you.*
4. *Your experience may potential develop into a School Based Apprenticeship.*

Students who are predominately studying Vocation courses and subjects are expected to attend work experience One day per week.

Students who are studying a mixed subject area may attend work experience during school holiday time or for a few weeks during the school term.

HOW DOES IT ALL WORK?

1. The student is to contact a potential employer
2. Ask if they would be willing to take them for Work Experience one day per week.
3. Obtain Employers Details
Company Name, Employers Name, Phone Number, Address, email

4. Bring Employer details to Mr Gray
5. Obtain a Work Agreement form from Mr Gray.
