Brisbane High School Design & Build Go Kart Challenge

Throughout the year a group of year 11 engineering students have worked hard to manufacture a Go Kart as a co curricula activity in preparation for the inaugural Brisbane High School Design & build Go Kart challenge at Archerfield.

Last Monday, Team Padua journeyed to the track to test out their kart against the competition.

Padua joined Marist Ashgrove, St Paul's Bald Hills and Sandgate SHS on the starting grid.

The Smith family organisation instigated the event to foster vocational interest in mechanical trades.

The competition began with judgement of overall appearance and standard of construction of each of the karts.

The judges were from TAFE and industry.

Team Padua consisted of Shane Eshmade, Dom Burchill, Sam Maker, Tore Calabrese, Julian Trombetta and Billy McIntosh.

The team spent some time getting used to the track before competition began.

Team members raced against the clock to establish their fastest times over the day.

All teams had work to do in the pits as various mechanical issues arose which had to be fixed to get the team back onto the track.

Unfortunately Padua's kart suffered from a repeated problem of throwing the chain later in the day requiring it to be re attached. In the end the time taken to try to find the problem cost Team Padua valuable track time.

At the end of a very successful day, Ashgrove was announced as the overall winner with Padua finishing in third position.

Many thanks to Mrs Eshmade who assisted greatly in providing transport for the team to and from the event.

All schools involved are looking forward to being involved again in 2015 giving boys an opportunity to be involved in the Go Kart challenge.

Having grown up in Australia, he attended Padua College, where he played in the First XI as Goalkeeper and also played at Albany Creek at club level. Young moved to England in 2002 to play professional football for Reading. After failing to break into the first team, he was released by Reading on 8 May 2006, and subsequently signed a one-year deal with Wycombe Wanderers on 2 August 2006.

He missed much of the 2007–08 season with a knee injury, but regained fitness by the end of the season.^[2] His contract was cancelled by mutual consent in January 2010 after he was informed that he would not be offered a new contract in the summer. He was signed on a non-contract basis by Aldershot Town of League Two on 11 March 2010 as cover for goalkeeper Mikhael Jaimez-Ruiz.^[3]

After impressing and establishing himself as the first choice goalkeeper, in the last quarter of the 2009–10 season, where Aldershot Town qualified for the League Two play-offs, Young signed a one-year contract with the club in June 2010. With the arrival of new goalkeeper Ross Worner in the 2011–12 season, Young was demoted to second choice goalkeeper but still managed to make a number of appearances in the later stage of the season when Worner was ruled out with a back injury. On 24 June 2012, Young signed a one-year contract to keep him with Aldershot until 2013.^[4]

Young left Aldershot in June 2013 after the club were relegated from the Football League and placed in administration.^[5] He played on game for Basingstoke Town in September as cover for their regular goalkeeper before joining fellow Conference South side Whitehawk the following month.^{[6][7]} After making only one appearance he moved again, this time joining Hayes & Yeading United.^[8] After making 10 appearances for Hayes & Yeading during its 2013–14 Conference South campaign, Young was released by manager Phil Babb following an on-field altercation with a team-mate in a 2–0 defeat to Bath City.^{[9][10]}

On 10 May 2014, it was reported that Young would return to his hometown to join A-League defending champion Brisbane Roar for the 2014–15 season.^[11]



Despite achieving great success in volleyball and basketball, Brady lists his greatest skill as 'eating'; which might explain why he's so massive.







NICK HARRIS, 19

I grew up in Brisbane. There are five of us in the family. Mum's a bookkeeper and Dad works for an airline.

Filmmaking wasn't in the family, it was just an interest that I got into in high school. I went to Nudgee College first and then went to Padua College. You had to pick three electives and I picked film and television, partly because I was interested, but partly because I didn't have any other classes that I could do. Subjects like music and biology were never really my thing.

Ever since I was little, I wanted to be a police officer and then after Year 12, I decided that it wasn't for me.

I've known Nicolas since 2004. He moved up from South Australia to Brisbane and went to the same school as me.

We can't remember why or when we became friends, it was just one of those things that happened. Our group of friends are particularly close and that was the same for me and Nic.

From a film-making perspective, we tend to balance each other out. I'm a producer, so I don't really deal with much of the creative side, that's more his job. I deal with the logistics and business side of things and then he deals with 99 per cent of the creative stuff. He'll come to me with his ideas and I'll say if it's feasible or not. We're completely honest with each other.

We've had our arguments, like anybody, we would butt heads. Nothing particularly bad. We tend to keep things pretty amicable. We know there's a job to be done and we do it.

The ad was made as part of a uni assignment (with classmates Michael Turner, 19, Mateusz Pungol, 19, Briana Goodchild, 19, and Anwen Tasene, 19, as well as Nicolas). We entered the Supercorp Auto Bathurst Big Break competition. It tells the story from a female perspective, she's upset that her husband is cheating on her. It's not revealed to the viewer until right at the end of the ad that her husband is having a love affair with his car. We did four weeks pre-production. The ad was shot in one day. There's a common misconception that you shoot a 30 second ad and it takes 30 minutes.

Winning the competition is humbling, but also really exciting. In such a cut-throat industry, our work is recognised as good enough for TV.

We were going up against production companies with probably double the amount of crew members and budget, and to be six uni students who obviously worked their butts off, I'm really proud.

We haven't quite decided what we're each going to do with the award money. I'm going travelling over to Europe.

I want to go into advertising. I'm a people person, I enjoy dealing with actors and agents. (The industry) has got a stigma of people being rude, crazy and sleep-deprived. But I don't want to go to a boring dead-end nine-to-five job where I sit at a desk and type away for 40 hours a week. I want to go to a job that excites me every day.

We wanted to actually do something that would help people. I was really fascinated that you could make an image and put text to it and that could change the way people see things. We don't have much money, Nick and I, because every bit we get ends up going into the next film project. The award money (from the Big Break competition) will go into buying the next set of camera gear or the next budget for our video.

This year, I coached Under-18s football at the Apley Hornets AFL.

I'm big on sport. Funny enough, (Nick) actually played in the team I coached this year.

He's so easy-going, no matter how big the problem is.

Everyone gets stressed and worked up, but at the end of the day, he looks at the positives. He's so caring.

I guess that's why he's my best mate and that's why we'll continue to be best mates and do a new video with each other every couple of weeks and not want to kill each other.

It's good.

Dear Members of the Padua College Community

We are writing to inform you of some decisions that have been made in relation to succession planning for the next Rector of Padua College. Many of you may be unaware that Mr Robert Out's contract, as Rector of Padua College, ends in December 2015. According to the terms of that contract, the position was to be advertised and Mr Out would be eligible to apply.

Recently, Mr Out has discussed with the Board of Directors and requested of the Provincial Definitory of the Friars, an extension of his contract until the end of 2016, after which he will retire from Padua College. The major reasons for the request are that in 2016, Padua College will celebrate 60 years of education in the Franciscan Tradition and Mr Out would like plan and continue to lead the College in those celebrations. The other reason is that the current strategic directions 'As One in 2016' will be finalised in 2016, allowing the next Rector to guide the process of a new strategic directions.

Given Mr Out's 36 years of service to the College, the Provincial Definitory have agreed to the extension of Mr Out's contract until December 2016. The process of the employment of a new Rector for 2017 and beyond will begin in March of 2016. Mr Out has the unqualified support of the Provincial Definitory and the Board of Directors for the remainder of his time at Padua College.
