Dear Paduans,

The year began with the College firing on all cylinders! Our new Rector, Peter Elmore began a review of the Mission Statement of the school, a revision of the Strategic Directions of Padua, and a new look at the Padua website. Peter has initiated "the listening post" inviting staff to join him in a consultative process to develop what is best for Padua. The staff have been involved in extensive Professional Development, with a focus now on the new Senior Assessment, that will replace the OP for Year 12 students. The ramifications of the Leuven Project are steadily been investigated, as we promote the Catholic Identity of Padua.

We welcomed a new Minister Provincial of the Friars, Fr Phillip Miscamble ofm to the College. He led us in the celebration of our Inaugural Eucharist. Phillip is originally from Roma, and has spent most of his priestly ministry in Singapore and Sydney. The friars at Adele Street have a new Guardian, Fr Mario Debattista ofm. He was Dux of Padua in 1976, and before joining the friars completed an Engineering Degree. Mario is on our Provincial Definitory and a member of the College Board.

As you have probably heard there was a Football tour to the UK earlier this year, and next week a group of our boys take off on a culture tour to Japan, many of them hoping to improve their Japanese language skills. Currently there is fundraising for an end of year Basketball tour to the U.S., as well as for 2018 Rugby tour to U.K. and Ireland.

There is great excitement about the place as we prepare to host the 2017 Confraternity Shield carnival. It will begin with Mass at La Cordelle for boys, coaches and officials. The games will be played at our Banyo grounds, with a few games on the Banyo campus of the Australian Catholic University - who are our major sponsor. More information. ## The Rector

Welcome to the latest edition of the Old Boys' magazine. For me, as a newcomer to the Paduan community, the contents of this magazine provide yet another window of discovery into the wonderful community of Padua. In my short time at Padua College, I have been amazed by the connection the boys have with their College and the strong sense of community. That same strong connection draws 'old boys' like you back to their College. There is certainly a lot to be proud of as publications like this one, enable us to stop and reflect on the happenings and achievements of Padua.

This year we have been working hard on a number of big projects. The College's Strategic Plan for 2017- 2020 has seen us consult widely with the community around the future directions for the College. At the heart of this consultation has been a confirmation that the College has been true to the original Mission and Vision Statements. These statements will continue to be guiding words as we continue to build on the fine traditions that have made Padua College what it is today. We will have plans that support our future directions around our Catholic tradition, teaching and learning, pastoral care and financial stewardship. We hope to have publicise the new Strategic Plan in October this year.

Another big project has been the preparations for hosting the Confraternity Carnival. This will be the fifth time the College has played host to the carnival. This year will be the largest ever Confraternity Carnival with 48 teams competing for the Confraternity Shield from June 25 to 30 at our Banyo Playing Fields. The carnival has certainly come a long way since we first hosted it way back in 1982. It is fitting that we are hosting the carnival in the same year that we named the College's greatest ever rugby league team. At a Sportsmen's Evening in April, Padua's strong connection to the code was reflected in a team that included four internationals and six State of Origin players. The team included names like Paul Vautin, Paul McCabe, Dane Carlaw, David Stagg, Lenny Ditmar, John McCabe and David Shillington. Our current First XIII coach Scott Maguire, with 199 QRL State League games, was named as five-eighth in the team.

This year I have taken on the words of St Benedict to 'Listen with the ear of your heart' by conducting a series of Listening Posts with staff. These informal gatherings have assisted me in better understanding the community. Along with the community consultation around the Strategic Plan, these gatherings provide an insight into the things that are distinctive about the Paduan community. Hugh McKay, a leading Australian social analyst suggested that, in Australia, many institutions lack a "guiding story" that connects a set of coherent values and beliefs that gives us a framework for making sense of our lives. In listening to the feedback from the community, this is certainly not the case at Padua, for at each meeting I hear that there is a strong connection back to the Franciscan ethos that founded this College. This ethos has, and will continue to be our 'guiding story', as we move forward with our Strategic Plan.





#### THE SINGERS AND THEIR SONG PADUA SECONDARY CHOIR

FADUA SECONDARY CHOIR Fye no idea how long ago people first began to sing, nor how long ago musical instruments were first invented, but I should say that both song and sound were spontaneous answers to a deep human need. In one of his University sermons, Cardinal Newman wrestles with the origin and beauty of musical sound. He wonders how such beauty as music can give us could possibly arise from the manipulation of such a slender scale of notes: "Is it possible that that inexhaust-

ible evolution and disposition of notes, so rich yet so simple, so intricate yet so regulated, so various yet so majestic, should be a mere sound, which is gone and perishes? Can it be that those mysterious stirrings of heart, and keen emotions, and strange yearnings after we know not what, and awful impressions from we know not where, should be wrought in us by what is unsubstantial, and comes and goes, and begins and ends in itself? It is not so; it cannot be. No; they have escaped from some higher sphere; they are the outpourings of eternal harmony in the medium of created sound; they are chosen from our Home; they



### Padua College Rugby League – A History

adua College's first rugby league team took the field as "Padua Brothers" in the 1959 Under 14 Brisbane Rugby League competition. The reason for this choice of codes is unclear but what is obvious is that the Friars were prepared to give their early students every opportunity available in a range of codes. Fr Alban wrote in that year

In the football season, you will see that whilst Rugby Union has been the main code, yet some have played Rules and a "Padua Brothers" team played Rugby League.

It truly was a "brothers" team in the sense that the Stark brothers (Michael and Peter) played in the inaugural League team. Given that Padua only had 16 boys in Year 9, they no doubt had to call on Peter even though he was in Year 7. The Paduan records this auspicious team in these words

An Under 14 team was fielded for the first time in Junior League. With the help of Brothers Club, the boys improved out of sight and won some hard games. The competition developed a high standard of fitness in the boys which benefitted them in other fields.

In 1960, the numbers grew and two "Padua Brothers" teams were fielded. The students obviously got better at the game because 3 boys were selected in the Brisbane side – P Murdoch, L Murphy and W Williamson. 1961 saw Padua's first Rugby League premiership albeit in Division 2. In 1962, The Catholic Colleges Rugby League was founded with Padua, St James and Iona as members. Padua played each school 3 times and won Premierships in Under 14 and the Open divisions (Peter Stark Best and Fairest in First XIII). Padua had gained its independence in the schoolboy rugby league world.

learly, rugby league was firmly established in the Secondary school in the early 60s. Even in these early years, some significant themes were beginning to emerge. The Friars would give their students every opportunity to develop their talents and abilities. The Friars were not egocentric. They looked outside the fledgling College for these opportunities. The early 60s saw Padua form relationships in Toowoomba to play more football. In 1962, Padua played De La Salle Cronulla in Brisbane (32-0 loss) and the return match in Sydney (16-0 loss). In 1963, CBC lpswich joined the CCRLA and Padua played a series of game against CBC Gympie. The Friars were also very willing to seek help from outside the school. In 1966, John Raper visited the school to talk rugby league with the students. In that year, Fr Alban had some very able assistants - John Gleeson, Denis Manteit and John Smith. They won the premiership undefeated and Len Dittmar was Best Forward and David Cunningham Best Back. In 1968, Denis Manteit and John Gleeson coached the First XIII and in the next year, Denis Manteit and Eric Gelling coached. A final theme surrounding rugby league at Padua, is the incessant disputes as to which year produced the best team. This seemed to begin in 1963

In the short history of Padua's Secondary College, 1963's Under 15A team must be recognised as one of the best teams that the College has produced, if not the best.

The growth in opportunity in rugby league in the 60s saw some other significant developments, not the least of which was the appearance of a new First XIII jersey in 1964. For the first time, Padua unveiled the brown jersey with two gold Vs. In that year, Padua played its first curtain-raiser under lights at the Exhibition Grounds (5-2 loss). Also, the CCRLA competition was replaced by the Associated Catholic Colleges competition in 1967. In that same year, Padua began playing St John's Woodlawn, a rivalry that would last 14 years. In 1969, the Padua badge appeared on several First XIII jerseys only to disappear again for many years.



uring the 70s the themes and the success continued. Fr Alban returned to Padua and coaching the First XIII. The rivalry with Woodlawn was firmly established although wins were very hard to come by. In 1970, the Under 15's beat Woodlawn. In 1974, the First XIII looked forward to the Woodlawn game (cancelled due to an outbreak of mumps in the boarding school) because they had won the ACC title undefeated and beaten Kedron High (State Champions that year). The 1975 First XIII travelled to New Zealand on a tour. Padua College made a very different shift in 1976 to try and secure better sporting opportunities. The school entered the Western Zone State School Competition and played in the AMCO Shield (a nation-wide competition) for the first time. In 1978, after moving to the Central Zone, the First XIII won the premiership. They also won the inaugural Queensland Catholic Colleges Rugby League Competition (the fore-runner to the Queensland Independent Secondary Schools Rugby League Competition). They were also finalists in the AMCO Shield (the second-best schoolboy team in the country after Patrician Brothers Fairfield). Finally, the decade closed with a First XIII victory against Woodlawn after 13 years of competition. Steve Davis was the vicecaptain of the side and soon to be an Australian Schoolboy representative.

The decade of the 80s started with the inaugural Queensland Independent Secondary Schools Rugby League Carnival (Canterbury Shield) being hosted at Christian Brothers College in Bundaberg. Padua College contested this Carnival losing in the final to Aquinas College 9-3, thus beginning an association that has lasted 38 years. The Carnival was significant in that it provided, for a time, a pathway for National representative honors. Michael Crowther and Michael Haydon took this pathway in the inaugural year becoming Australian representatives. Michael Crowther (C), John Cashman, Michael Ward, Craig Munro, Rod Hickey and Anthony Benedetti represented Queensland. In 1982, Padua won the Central Zone premiership for the second time and were finalists in the Metropolitan A Grade Final. In the same year, Padua hosted the QISSRL competition for the first of 5 times (1982,1984,1992,2006 and 2017).

Wayne Halverson and Mark McSweeney were selected in the QISSRL Representative side.





In 1984, Padua College won the Canterbury Shield for the first time, going on to win the Confraternity Shield in 1997 and 2005. During this year, Padua contested the West Tamworth Leagues Club Schoolboy Carnival playing against Sydney and NSW country schools. This association lasted 11 years until 1994. It was an extremely strong competition. Padua's best result was winning the Division 2 final in 1991. In 1985, Padua changed its famous brown and gold jersey by adding the school badge permanently. Due to rugby league schoolboy politics in 1985, the QISSRL side went from being a representative side to being a merit side. The remainder of the 80s was uneventful except for the selection of Scott Maguire (current First XIII coach) in the QISSRL side.

During the early 90s, it was clear that the sporting opportunities for most Padua students were being limited by the standard of the State School competition. Courageously, Fr John Boyd-Boland decided to enter The Associated Schools competition, thus making Rugby Union and Football (Soccer) Padua's major football codes. Padua continued to enter the QISSRL Carnival, except for 1995, but the preparation for this very strong carnival was limited. This limitation did not deter the 1997 side from winning the final against St Brendan's (arguably the strongest carnival ever).

With limited opportunities to play rugby league, Padua College continued to contest the Confraternity Shield into the new millennium. A Shield win in Toowoomba in 2005 and three wins in the Bob Lindner Trophy (2008, 2014 and 2015) are highlights in recent times.


Padua College can be rightfully proud of its rugby league tradition and success. From very humble beginnings, through some "Golden Years" and beyond into more difficult times, any Padua student, who has worn the brown jersey with the two gold Vs, is proud to say that he did. The College is very proud of its Australian Representatives – Dane Carlaw, Paul McCabe, David Shillington and Paul Vautin. We are equally proud of our Queensland Representatives – Len Dittmar, John McCabe and David Stagg. There is no doubt that Paduans, who have represented their Country, their State, their NRL clubs, Queensland Cup clubs or Padua College remember with fondness the opportunities given to them to play rugby league with their mates at Padua College.


